CARE & CLEAN OF SOLID SURFACE



CLEANING TOOLS AND PRODUCTS:

- · Cotton and Microfiber cloths
- · Hot soapy water
- · Standard degreasing spray
- · Mild cream abrasive cleaner with micro crystals
- · Soft abrasive scour pad
- · Pure bleach (without soap)
- · Sandpaper, sponge based (P400) or abrasive scour pad with similar roughness

EVERYDAY CLEANING:

Even though liquids cannot penetrate Solid Surface, is it best to clean out spills as they happen using a damp cotton or microfiber cloth with warm soapy water or a standard degreasing spray, that should remove most stains. Always clean using a circular motion/pattern making sure at the end of the cleaning process, that all the vanity surface is dry.

However, try to avoid using window cleaners, as may leave the countertop surface slightly waxed darkening or dulling the surface.

PERSISTENT STAINS CLEANING:

No matter how difficult it may seem to clean, always try the easy way first as described on previously. For persistent stains, after having tried to clean them out the easy way, you can progress with an abrasive scour pad with mild cream abrasive cleaner and a bit of water, applying moderate force and always in circular motion. Clear the surface with a damp microfiber cloth and finally dry all the surface with a dry cotton cloth. You should only use a soft abrasive pad or sanding paper "P400 or softer" if it's an extremely persistent stain or if the surface of the washbasin has any sort of damage like scratches. As well as with the previous methods, always polish the surface in circular motion, then use a mop microfiber cloth to remove the dust and finally dry the surface with a dry cotton cloth.

RESTORING TREATMENT:

Once a month, it is advisable to clean the entire countertop, especially the basin, using a solution of 100ml of household bleach and 1 liter of water.

For the countertop area, you can use a sprayer to spray all the surface and leave it for 1-2 hours before clearing all the surface with water damp cloth using a circular motion and later drying the surface with a dry cotton or microfiber cloth.

For the basin area, you can clog the valve and fill the basin with warm water and add about 50 to 100 ml of household bleach into it, then let it for couple of hours and let the water drain opening the valve. Dry the surface of the basin with a dry microfiber or cotton cloth meanwhile the basin is still wet, again using a circular motion. This process will bring back the original whiteness and beauty on you washbasin regularly.
